Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan Priorities

The Local Fire and Rescue Service Plan has been developed to set out the priorities and objectives within North East Glasgow and allows our local authority partners to scrutinise the performance outcomes of these priorities. We will continue to work closely with our partners in North East Glasgow to ensure we are all “**Working Together for a Safer Scotland**” through targeting risks to our communities at a local level.

The plan has been developed to complement key partnership activity embedded across the Glasgow Community Plan and associated Delivery and Thematic plans. Through partnership working we will seek to deliver continuous improvement in our performance and effective service delivery in our area of operations.

The Local Fire and Rescue Plan for Glasgow identified six areas for demand reduction and is subject to regular monitoring and reporting through the Police / Fire and Rescue Committee. A summary of the priorities and current activity is detailed below with further detail and analysis contained within this performance report.




Activity by Time of Day

North East Glasgow Operational Trends



However, over the 5-year reporting period there has been both a slight fall and rise in our response to fires. This is something we are continually trying to reduce through post fire engagement with members of the public and working with Police Scotland and local groups to raise awareness and help change contributing behaviours.




Accidental Dwelling Fires Activity by Ward (% share)

There has been a slight fall in accidental dwelling fires over the quarter, although over the period of the current Covid-19 pandemic domestic fires have increased. This is most likely as a result in changes to behaviour and routines linked to people staying at home. A high percentage, close to 50%, of fires have required no firefighting action, with cooking appliance being the main source of ignition. This is an area where we continually advise and promote safe practices within the home through our Post Domestic Incident Response, Home Fire Safety Visits and Community Engagements. The comforting part is that detection actuated to raise the alarm for 77% of incidents, we will continue to fit detection where required during our responses or home visits.






Accidental Dwelling Fires Casualties




Accidental Dwelling Fire Casualties by Ward (% share)




Fire Casualties by Time of Day








Non-Fire Casualties by Ward (% share)














Deliberate Fires by Ward (% share)




Deliberate Fires by Time of Day






Primary Fire Ratio by Activity Type



Deliberate Fires Compared to Operational Activity










Non-Domestic Fires by Nature of Origin










