The Provision of Winter Hub Services for 2025 & 2026

Tender Reference: - GCC006448CPU

Purpose of Report:

To submit details of the tenders received for the provision of winter hub services for 2025 & 2026 and recommend acceptance of the most economically advantageous tender as detailed in this report.

1 Background and Tender

- 1.1 The council's requirement for the provision of Winter Hub services for 2025 and 2026 has been procured as a service concession contract under the Concession Contract Regulations 2016. This is a contractual arrangement between a public authority and an economic operator (the concession holder). The latter provides services or carries out works and is remunerated by being permitted to exploit the work or service at its own risk and with no cost being incurred by Glasgow City Council ("the council").
- 1.2 The council undertook a strategic review of the city's overall Christmas offering which identified an opportunity to develop a unique, innovative, and inclusive winter offering, moving away from that of a traditional Christmas market delivered previously to a festive Winter Hubs approach. A new vision for Glasgow's winter events was developed, creating a more coherent approach to winter, bringing together commercial, civic and community events under a single umbrella to attract visitors, engage citizens and support city centre vibrancy.
- 1.3 The council is seeking to appoint a single concessionaire to deliver Winter Hubs across 2 prime locations: Glasgow Green and St Enoch's Square. These key festive attractions will serve to attract visitors from the city and beyond into the city centre, encourage dwell time there and promote subsequent additional visits to the city's retail and hospitality sectors. It will have a broad appeal and be firmly family focused with attractions for all age groups.
- 1.4 A commodity team consisting of stakeholders from Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS), Glasgow Life, and the Corporate Procurement Unit (CPU) was formed to develop the sourcing strategy and deliver a new concession services contract.
- 1.5 It was agreed that an open tender process would be the most appropriate method to deliver this contract. The opportunity was advertised via UK Find a Tender Service and Public Contracts Scotland.
- 1.6 The term of the contract is from October 2025 to January 2027 with exact dates to be confirmed post award. The contract will be utilised by NRS.
- 1.7 NRS will monitor the concessionaire's day to day operational performance. Overall contract and concessionaire performance will be managed by the CPU.

2 Evaluation

- 2.1 16 concessionaires expressed an interest in this opportunity. Of the 16, 4 submitted a bid. Of the 12 concessionaires that failed to respond, 4 cited the opportunity was not suitable for their organisations, 2 cited they did not feel that adequate time had been provided to deliver the contract and suggested a longer lead in time for contract award, 1 cited inability to fulfill all elements of the contract, and the remaining 5 concessionaires did not provide any feedback.
- 2.2 The award evaluation was based on the following criteria and weightings:-

2.3 The evaluation score of the concessionaire recommended for award is shown in the table below:-

3 Contract implementation and Supplier Management

- 3.1 The outcome of our Contract Management Assessment Tool (CMAT) has deemed this contract to be categorised as low. The supplier will be monitored in line with our contract and supplier management process which includes tracking the concessionaire's performance against the key performance indicators and working collaboratively to identify opportunities of improvement and innovation. It is expected that meetings with the supplier will also take place much more frequently, as and when required throughout the 6-week delivery of the event.
- 3.2 The agreed community benefits outcome commitments will be monitored via Cenefits which is a web based monitoring tool. We will also capture sustainable commitments within the CPU Sustainable Register.
