Background

1. The City Administration Committee on 13th February 2024 allocated £67,115.22 to the 2024/25 Cardonald Area Budget.

Expenditure

2. £66,348.91 (98.9%) of the allocation has been awarded for projects that were delivered by 31st March 2025.

Our Lady of the Rosary Nursery Class Outdoor Play Area PRN:549/11	Yes	Summary of Project We were using the Area Funding to help us use our garden area all year round in a more purposeful way. The garden was given to us from Stalled Space as it was land on which the janitors house had sat. The only problem was that we have had to fund the development of the garden by ourselves, we have been doing this slowly over the past few years. We have been developing growing areas, to grow fruit and veg. We have cleared away large areas of trees and foliage to make the garden area safe and secure to allow us to create many interesting play areas for the children to learn independently. We had visits from City of Glasgow College students via the Personal Development department, which helps them develop skills and knowledge to support future studies and career pathways. We had a group of parents/grandparents who have advised and help us keep the garden tidy/safe for growing and planting and to develop our children's understanding of sustainability. The children enjoyed the planning, choosing, erecting and playing/investigation new equipment in the garden. The mud kitchen can be very busy at times, and having the larger space with good quality resources makes such a difference. Impact of Project Our children have enjoyed the outdoor space every day. It has given a rundown area a purpose while giving the children a natural and safe area to learn in. They have enjoyed watching their strawberries grow but need to think of a way to keep the squirrels away. The grandparents have enjoyed the challenges as well as meeting new friend, both young and old!

Pollock United Nethercraigs Defensible Space Project	Yes	Summary of Project The project was to improve security and safety at our site by installing secured gates to replace temporary fencing that was not fit for purpose. The new gates were installed by Parkhead welding Company in November 2024, works completed within one week.
PRN:107/24		Impact of Project The installation of the gates has increased/improved security at the site making the area a defensible space. This has improved the safety for service users, particularly the young people and primary school children who attend our activities, especially our after-school care provision. Ultimately the increased security of the site has resulted in a decrease in site breaches.

Hillington Park Church Hall Equipment		Summary of Project To purchase movable chairs and stacks to go with our refurbished church hall. The hall is used by many different groups such meeting the needs of the most vulnerable in our community like young people, senior citizens, recovering addicts and those affected by poverty.
PRN:296/16		Impact of Project The chairs and stacks have made a massive impact to the hall as it allows us to easily move and utilize the chairs for the different groups. Some groups require chairs more than others and they are now lightweight enough for us to move with ease. The stacks also provide easy and additional storage for the chairs when not needed, this allows more floor space for the groups that need it. When needed we can easily move the chairs from place to another.
