AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Recommendations:

Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2024 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The Greater Pollok Area Budget for 2025/26 is £90,546. Due to an over allocation in 2024/25 the Greater Pollok budget for 2025/26 will be £83,592.
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £47,614 from the 2025/26 Area Budget. £00.00 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £47,614 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £42,932 yet to be allocated.
