AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

### **Purpose of Report:**

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

#### Recommendations:

The Area Partnership is asked to:

- (1) note the budget position for 2025/26; and
- (2) consider the recommendations on applications received for Area Budget funding in 2025/26, as detailed in appendix 1.

#### Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

# Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2025. The Maryhill Area Budget for 2025/26 is £66,444.00
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £34,014 from the 2025/26 Area Budget to date, had been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £32,430 yet to be allocated.

## Ineligible applications.

- 5. The following applications were ineligible for Area Partnership funding:
  Members are asked to note that, due to recent updates to the Area Budget criteria (outlined below), the following Applications requesting funding from all 23 Area Partnerships are deemed ineligible.
  - Applications that are made to more than one Area Partnership to consider will be limited to neighboring electoral wards and within the sectors of South, North-West and North-East Glasgow.

The Communities Team will reach out to the Applicants to offer support and guidance for any future Area Budget submissions.
