

Area Budget 2024/25 – Applications for funding dealt with etc – Declaration of interest.

12 With reference to the minutes of the Council’s City Administration Committee of 21st March 2024, when the committee approved the 2024/25 Area Budget allocations, there was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance, advising

- (1) of the current position in relation to the Area Partnership’s budget for 2024/25;
- (2) that the Partick East/Kelvindale Area Partnership’s Budget allocation for 2024/25 was £60,284.20 and that £49,372 had been allocated to date, leaving a balance of £10,912.20; and
- (3) of the applications for funding from the Area Budget for 2024/25.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the position regarding the Area Budget allocation for 2024/25; and
- (b) dealt with applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:

*Notre Dame High School	To purchase a new speaker system for the school assembly hall	Awarded £5,859.79
Police Scotland	To purchase a range of cycling safety equipment for use as part of Police Scotland community engagement	Refused due to work already being carried out by Police Scotland and that it was not the AP priority with the remaining 2024/25 funding
The DRC Youth Project (SCIO)	Towards the cost to support weekend street work to boost engagement in DRCYP activities in Partick East/Kelvindale and strengthening of partnership working	Awarded £1,780 subject to condition that the participants are from the Partick East/Kelvindale Ward
