1 Background

- 1.1 Each year Glasgow Education Services is required by the Scottish Government to present a report on our progress in each of the areas in the National Improvement Framework. The data required is determined by the Scottish Government (SG) and we provide a narrative to inform the data analysis. The report sent to SG is attached to this paper as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Local Authorities are also asked to contain information on their progress related to 'Stretch Aims'. Iver the past few years, these Stretch Aims involved schools looking at their Achievement of Curriculum for Excellence Levels (ACEL) data for the previous years and using this to determine what schools feel are realistic targets for groups of children and young people in primary 1, 4 and 7 and secondary 3. Secondary schools were also asked to provide Stretch Aims for National 5 and 6 (Higher) SQA qualifications.
- 1.3 Schools were also asked to provide a Stretch Aim for 'health and wellbeing'. We use the attendance statistics as our indicator. The data also highlights exclusions and the Annual Participation measure.
- 1.4 ACEL data is more current whilst the Senior Phase data is for 2023/24 since the national comparator figures for diet 2024/25 are not published until February 2026 on Insight.
