Glasgow Community Planning Partnership - Strategic Partnership.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

1 The minutes of 26th November 2024 were submitted and approved.

Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Legal and Administration providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising

- (1) that Paul McCafferty had replaced Garry Williamson as the representative for Scottish Enterprise;
- (2) that Superintendent Ryan McMurdo had replaced Superintendent David Reid as substitute representative for Police Scotland; and
- (3) of the current membership of the Strategic Partnership, as detailed in the report.

Glasgow Community Plan - Performance Framework – Update noted etc.

3 With reference to the minutes of 14th June 2024 agreeing the next steps to shape the Local Outcome Improvement Plan's Performance Framework, there was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance regarding the new Glasgow Community Planning Partnership's (GCPP) Performance Framework,

- (1) advising
 - (a) of the approach that had been taken to co-design the GCPP new Performance Framework and the principles that had underpinned this shared work;
 - (b) of the series of core outcomes that had been proposed for delivery by the Partnership as well as a suite of measures that would provide insight in relation to progress and impact and which would drive action; and
 - (c) of the work required of partners to fully test, iterate and develop the Performance Framework over the course of the next 6 months; and
- (2) detailing in the appendices to the report, definitions of the GCPP's agreed approaches, the GCPP Wireframe Framework Structure and the GCPP Framework measures.

After consideration, and having heard a presentation from Adam Hall, The Improvement Service regarding the work carried out to support the Partnership in the development of the Framework, the Partnership

- (i) noted
 - (A) the process undertaken to create the new Performance Framework and acknowledge this is a test of change in a wider public service reform context; and
 - (B) that further updates would be brought back to the December meeting;
- (ii) discussed and provided feedback on the proposed outcomes and the suite of measures to understand impact and drive action for the citizens of Glasgow; and
- (iii) agreed to work with partners to
 - (A) further socialise and test these over the next 6 months, including undertaking wider engagement with communities; and
 - (B) continue to collaborate on deploying resource and expertise, including building capacity to change, to achieve the outcomes in the Framework.

Public Service Reform / Child Poverty Programme - Presentation noted etc.

4 There was heard and noted a presentation by the Head of Transformation and Financial Inclusion and Programme Director for Child Poverty and Prevention regarding their ongoing work to assist families out of poverty, where there is a child under 5 years old, advising

- (1) of the targeted approach that had been undertaken in the 3 wards, namely Southside Central (Ward 8), Calton (Ward 9) and Govan (Ward 5), which had been identified to pilot the Demonstration of Change initiative to tackle poverty and improve long-term outcomes for families;
- (2) that the aim of the initiative was to provide a comprehensive, person-centred approach to early intervention, employment support and overall community wellbeing;
- (3) that the intention was to build any potential solution or system change on the infrastructure of what already existed, and that this change approach had ensured that the voice of local people was absorbed into the reflections and analysis of what needed to be done differently;
- (4) that the application of targeted data and data analysis had been applied to provide greater understanding and focus within each of the wards to identify barriers encountered by families; and
- (5) of the themes and insights that had been highlighted by taking a deep dive into the 3 wards and the targeted approach that had been undertaken in each of the Wards to address child poverty, and the progress that had been made to date.

Area Partnerships - Survey on area budget criteria – Proposals approved etc.

5 There was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance regarding the findings from a survey of Area Partnership members across the city on the criteria for area budgets,

- (1) advising
 - (a) that the criteria for funding from the area budgets had not been formally reviewed since 2015 and there had been concern that the criteria should be reviewed to reflect rising costs;
 - (b) of the practices that had become more prevalent over time that had been considered in the review of the process;
 - (c) that the survey had been available to approximately 400 Area Partnership members and substitutes over a 4-week period from 13th January to 10th February 2025; and

- (d) of the proposals that had been developed from the responses received;
and
- (2) detailing in the appendix to the report, the full results of the survey.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (i) noted
 - (A) the results of the survey on the area budget criteria; and
 - (B) that further work would be conducted on improving the area budget process including engagement with members of Area Partnerships; and
- (ii) approved the proposals contained in paragraph 8 of the report.
