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1. Background

- 1.1 The [Council Strategic Plan](#) was agreed at Full Council on 27 October 2022 and the Operational Performance Delivery and Scrutiny Committee is tasked with monitoring the delivery of the Strategic Plan. The review of the Strategic Plan was completed and presented to [Full Council](#) in October 2024.
- 1.2 Following agreement at the [Operational and Delivery Scrutiny Committee](#) (OPDSC) in November 2022, a template has been issued to all Services. The template structures and supports scrutiny of the Strategic Plan and illustrates the crosscutting nature of the Missions, as Services work together to deliver the Council's priorities. The template is subject to review to ensure Service and Member feedback is incorporated.

2. Council Strategic Plan

- 2.1 The Strategic Plan has been structured into 4 Grand Challenges and their supporting missions. The Grand Challenges are:
 1. Reduce poverty and inequality in our communities.
 2. Increase opportunity and prosperity for all our citizens.
 3. Fight the climate emergency in a just transition to a net zero Glasgow.
 4. Enable staff to deliver essential services in a sustainable, innovative and efficient way for our communities.
- 2.2 Each Grand Challenge is underpinned by Missions and Commitments. Services undertake the work to achieve the Commitments which in turn contributes to the goal of each Mission. This report focuses on:
 - Grand Challenge 3: Fight the climate emergency in a just transition to a net zero Glasgow
 - Mission 1: Deliver sustainable transport and travel aligned with the city region.
 - Mission 2: Become a net zero carbon city by 2030.
- 2.3 Council has agreed that the Strategic Plan will be subject to an annual review to reflect the volatility of outside pressures and budget constraints. There is a transparent change control process in place to assist this.
- 2.4 Council has previously received updates on Grand Challenge 3, Missions 1 and 2, on [6th November 2024](#), [12th March 2025](#) and [3rd September 2025](#).

3. Commitments and Emerging Commitments

3.1 Work is in progress to deliver the Strategic Plan commitments across key areas.

3.2 Some key areas relating to Grand Challenge 3 are included in this report. These are:

- Delivery of the fleet strategy objectives of decarbonising the fleet, transitioning to zero emissions vehicles by 2030, and identify opportunities for modal shift within journeys.
- Building on our Glasgow Transport Strategy policy framework, create a new Parking Plan to reduce car parking spaces and extend controlled parking zones.
- Supporting the development of business cases for the Clyde Metro project.
- Expanding Nextbike and car-sharing scheme.
- Delivering the city's Active Travel Strategy.
- Continuing to improve the heat and energy efficiency of the council's property assets, ensuring high standards in new buildings and completing retrofit, where viable throughout the existing estate.
- Developing a Community Energy Strategy to support the establishment of community energy organisations to generate renewable energy and support the development of local heat networks.
- Delivering the Depot Review to ensure facilities are fit for purpose.
- Continuing work to reduce Vacant and Derelict Land, prioritising brownfield sites for development and ensuring adequate protection for Green Belt and designated Open Space.
- Developing an investment strategy to support the council's-built heritage.
- Delivering increased tree planting across the city as part of a comprehensive Tree Plan for Glasgow.

3.3 Two actions were noted as performing at Amber, these relate to the following commitment:

- Deliver sustainable urban drainage and promote nature-based solutions to manage flooding and pollution

4. Next Steps

- 4.1 The Strategic Plan remains under review so as to allow for consideration of emerging commitments. Where appropriate these commitments will be considered through the approval process for future inclusion in the Strategic Plan.

Phase 2 will be developed within 2026, as it is important that it takes learning from this initial pilot phase of the CREF. This development will include a review of the process followed for site selection and other priority areas.</p>

Synopsis (100 words)	The Community Renewable Energy Framework aims to support the increased generation of renewable energy from community-owned assets by identifying a portfolio of sites which are suitable for community-led renewable energy development and outlining a process that enables GCC to work with communities to enable the delivery of such projects.
The challenge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Volatile energy market contributing to higher energy bills. • Significant areas of Vacant and derelict land across the city. • Availability of suitable funding resources to finance projects. • Internal staff resource to support communities to deliver renewable energy projects.

The impact (including cost savings/income generated if applicable)	The CREF aims to have a positive impact on communities who have an interest in the development of renewable energy projects. The support provided through the CREF takes the form of capacity building, technical upskilling, engagement and business case development. Once communities have developed their proposal and agreements on lease arrangements have been reached, direct impacts will be realised within the communities. These will be determined by the business case created by the community themselves.
How is the new approach being sustained?	<p>Officers will continue to work through the CREF working group and utilise external partners from Local Energy Scotland to provide direct support to communities. This means that the staff resource required to support the communities will be spread across multiple teams.</p> <p>In addition, we have secured officer time from a community renewable energy specialist secondment to GCC for 1 day a week for the period of 1 year to specifically support community engagement.</p>
Lessons learned:	A full lessons-learned exercise will be undertaken in the second half of phase 1, starting in Jan 2026. This will include a review of the process followed for site selection and could also include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Identification of additional sites. - Exploration of how sites could be proposed to the CREF team by community groups or residents. - Feedback on process and supporting materials. - Community access to technical support.
