1. The City Administration Committee on 15th February 2024 allocated £114,591.36 to the 2024/25 East Centre Area Budget.

Expenditure

2. £114,481.70 of the allocation has been awarded for projects that were delivered by 31st March 2025.

Cranhill Community Council St Maria Goretti's church Hall Refurbishment of Toilets	Yes	The roof repairs were to be carried out before any work could begin on the refurbishment of the toilets. This was organised and paid for by the Parish Council. The refurbishment was carried out by a contactor (on his own) until he required the assistance of a joiner to deal with the doors and boxing in the sink basins. An electrician was needed to do lighting and other electrical works (hot water etc). There was no access to the toilets or chapel hall from Jan/Feb until mid-March 2025. A major clean-up was required before the refurb began by ripping out the door frames, removing all doors (some of which needed to be replaced (toilet cubicles). It took longer than any of us had envisaged clearing out all the debris, cleaning and drying out the shell of each toilet cubicle before the refurbishment could begin. Given that we had issues with flooding over the years and toilets have not had any kind of makeover in the last 25 years. It				
472/23		took 3 people to completely clear out the toilets and some volunteers were on hand to help. The refurbishment began late Feb and was completed in Mar 2025. The installation of the wet walls, the				

ceiling, and floors then the sink basins, toilets, lighting and doors were installed. The disabled toilet was last to be refurbished, to allow all parishioners' access to facilities. Ladies WC was completed first, then the Gents WC and finally the disabled WC. Throughout this time, we were unable to open the hall for

The children now have access to a Literacy, Numeracy, Drama and Den building area where they can build on their learning outdoors.ie science, nature, expressive arts etc. An outdoor shelter was purchased to allow children to access outdoor clothing and wellingtons as well as a shaded area in the sun. This helps develop independence skills where children are learning to dress themselves and change their shoes. Outdoor free flow play is a benefit to all children who attend our nursery. Our project has allowed the children to access areas that will have a good impact on their learning as well as physical development, independent skills and over all well being.
