AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Recommendations:

The Area Partnership is asked to:

- (1) note the budget position for 2025/26; and
- (2) consider the recommendations on applications received for Area Budget funding in 2025/26, as detailed in appendix 1.

Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2024 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The Hillhead Area Budget for 2025/26 is £61,839.
- 3. The Area Partnership has committed £34,066 from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on 1st April 2025 and £3,047 was committed at its meeting on the 22nd of May 2025. A total of £37,113 has been committed from the 2025/26 Area Budget since the last Area Partnership Meeting and £1,318 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £38,431 (62%) has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £23,408 (38%) yet to be allocated.

Applications dealt with under Delegated Functions.

5. No applications have been dealt with since the last meeting of the Area Partnership under Delegated Functions.

6. There were no ineligible applications in this round of funding for Hillhead.
