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AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Introduction.

 This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2025/26 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The East Centre Area Budget for 2025/26 is £114.591.00
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £22,717.00 from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on 2nd April 2025 and £2,100.00 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £24,817.00 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £89,774.00 yet to be allocated.
