

Area Budget 2025/26 – Applications for funding dealt with etc.

10 With reference to the minutes of the Council's City Administration Committee of 13th March 2025, when the committee approved the 2025/26 Area Budget allocations, there was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance, advising

- (1) of the current position in relation to the Area Partnership's budget for 2025/26;
- (2) that the Govan Area Partnership's Budget allocation for 2025/26 was £90,149 and that £61,649 had been allocated to date, leaving a balance of £28,500; and
- (3) of the applications for funding from the Area Budget for 2025/26.

After consideration, the Partnership

 - (i) the position regarding the Area Budget allocation for 2025/26; and
 - (ii) the applications dealt with under delegated functions, as detailed in the report; and
- (b) dealt with applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:

Halo Arts Govan Pantomime	Towards the cost of delivering a community pantomime 'Pinocchio' to the Govan schools as well as two community shows	Awarded £4,137
Cycling Without Age Scotland (CWAS)	Towards the cost of purchasing a trishaw to be cited at Pollok Park, which would offer rides around the park for those who are unable to make their own way round, including care home residents in the park's vicinity	Refused due to the distance for Govan ward residents to Pollok Park but would consider the project should the organisation base it within the Govan Ward
Kinning Park Complex	Towards the cost of delivering a mindful connections programme that would offer Yoga, Reiki, Sound Therapy and Shared Meal sessions to the community throughout the year	Awarded £1,691
Home Start South	Towards the cost of upgrading the website and enhancing social media content with up-to-date accessible information for all users	Refused due to the excessive costs and limited Area Budget 2025/26 funds
Glasgow South West Foodbank	Towards the cost of supporting emergency food and hygiene supplies to those most in need	Awarded £2,000
LOOP Theatre SCIO	Towards the cost of delivering a creative programme for adults with severe and complex additional support needs, especially those struggling with social isolation	Awarded £5,160
Imagine Station CIC	Towards the cost of supporting a safe inclusive space for neurodivergent children and their families in Govan	Awarded £9,015 on the condition that free support is provided to Govan Ward attendees
Impact Arts	Towards the cost of supporting the delivery of the Govan Craft Café which enables vulnerable older people in the area to take part in craft activities	Awarded £5,000
