1. Background

- 1.1 The Governance Framework for the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership structures sets out a key role for the Area Partnerships which includes the following:-

To co-ordinate the development and implementation of electoral ward level Neighbourhood Management action plans which respond to local needs and opportunities.

- 1.2 As part of developing a ward Neighbourhood Management Action Plan, the Area Partnerships identified a key priority of crime with a focus on anti-social behaviour.
- 1.3 In order to drive this agenda, the Calton Area Partnership considered reports at recent meetings. The report at the last meeting of the Area Partnership provided an update on the Anti-Social Behaviour outcomes.

2. Calton Area Partnership Anti-Social Behaviour Outcomes

- 2.1 At the meeting of the Area Partnership on the 3rd December 2014, the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan.
- 2.2 A summary of the progress made by the Partnership in relation to the agreed outcomes since the last meeting is detailed below:-

Young people made more aware of provision in their area

Neighbourhood Management Meeting

A meeting was convened on 17th September 2015 and attended by colleagues from Land and Environmental Services (Cleansing and Landscape Design), Development and Regeneration Services and Tenure Housing Association to discuss a proposal for improvement works at Tobago Street.

Finalised Proposal

The agreed proposal was developed in conjunction with all partners on the group and Calton Area Association.

Tobago Street – Proposed Improvements to Vacant Ground:-

It is proposed to enhance the large expanse of vacant ground in the area bounded by Tobago Street and Stevenson Street. Works will include the removal of large items of rubble from the perimeter bund and the soiling and grass seeding of this to provide a readily maintainable verge. All dumped material within the site will be removed. The concrete slab currently covering the central area of the site will be broken up and soiled over to provide a seed bed suitable to support meadow planting to provide seasonal flowering interest. The developing shrub screen (Buddleia) along the boundary of the former co-operative building will be retained but other scrub will be cleared to provide clear site lines across the area.

Agreed Actions

Organisation/departments were asked to consider a bill of quantities to deliver the finalised proposal and confirm which elements their department/organisation could contribute to either as an in-kind contribution or match-funding.

Any shortfall in funding would be absorbed by the Calton Area Budget subject to criteria and available funding.
