

Overview

During October through to December 2015 the ward experienced the 17th highest concentration out of the total number of environmental reports across the city. This has decreased compared with the previous three months (July – September 2015), when the ward experienced the 12th highest level of reports. Throughout October to December, there has been decrease in all environmental activity, when compared to July – September 2015, with the exception of fly posting reports. There has been no change in the number of dog fouling or needles/sharps/blood reports.

Key Points

- There has been a **20% reduction** in the level of fly tipping reported to the Calton Ward during October through to December, with **115** incidents recorded compared to **81** from July to September 2015.
- Fly tipping activity was problematic in the London Road area.
- Street Cleansing reports have **decreased** from October – December. There were **32** incidents recorded compared to **46** during July to September.
- There was a **decrease of 46%** in the level of public reported graffiti during the period, with **15** incidents recorded in comparison to **26** from July through to September 2015.
- Reports of dog fouling have remained consistent with **7** incidents recorded.
- There were **17** fixed penalty notices issued for dog fouling during the previous three months (October – December 2015)
- Litter reports **decreased** during October – December, **13** incidents were recorded in comparison to **39** from July to September 2015.
- There were **42** fixed penalty notices issued for littering from October to December 2015.
- From October through to December, **103** environmental clean ups took place in the Ward.



Forecast

- Moving into the next quarter we would expect to experience an increase in fly tipping, litter and street cleansing, particularly during January as residents dispose refuse after the festive period.
- Problematic areas will be identified for the next assessment.

Chart – Environmental Report Ward vs Glasgow Average





Chart – Monthly Trend Year to date Remedy Reports (Seven Areas)




Maps Demand vs. Activity





Chart – Monthly Trend Year to date Needles/sharps/blood




Chart – Monthly Trend Year to date Fly Tipping



Priority Area Location


Based on incident levels, concentration of reports and the type of environmental activity recorded, the area surrounding Bail Street and Millroad Street has been identified as a priority location for environmental incivility during the period of October to December 2015.

Location: Bain Street/ Millroad Street

Issue: Fly Tipping & Needles/Sharps/Blood

There were 24 environmental incidents reported in the priority area during October to December. This figure has decreased compared with the previous three months (July – September 2015) when there were 26 reports recorded. The main issues reported in the area were public reported graffiti and street cleansing.

- Fly tipping activity was reported throughout the priority location during the period with no particular street identified as a hotspot.
- There were 7 reports of needles/sharps/blood reported to the area from October to December 2015.
- Environmental reports were higher between the hours of 13:00 & 14:00, with a higher level of incidents recorded on a Monday.
