1. Background

- 1.1 The Governance Framework for the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership structures sets out a key role for the Area Partnerships which includes the following:-

To co-ordinate the development and implementation of electoral ward level Neighbourhood Management action plans which respond to local needs and opportunities.

- 1.2 As part of developing a ward Neighbourhood Management Action Plan, the Area Partnerships identified a key priority of crime with a focus on anti-social behaviour.
- 1.3 In order to drive this agenda, the Calton Area Partnership considered reports at recent meetings. The report at the last meeting of the Area Partnership provided an update on the Anti-Social Behaviour outcomes.

2. Calton Area Partnership Anti-Social Behaviour Outcomes

- 2.1 At the meeting of the Area Partnership on the 3rd December 2014, the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan.
- 2.2 A summary of the progress made by the Partnership in relation to the agreed outcomes since the last meeting is detailed below:-

Young people made more aware of provision in their area

Reduction in loitering/Increase feeling in community safety

Reduction in misuse of vacant and derelict land

Neighbourhood Management Meeting

A meeting was convened on 19th June 2015 and attended by colleagues from Clyde Gateway, Land and Environmental Services (Cleansing and Landscape Design), Community Safety Glasgow, Development and Regeneration Services and Thenu Housing Association to discuss the vacant and derelict land sites previously identified.

Discussions

East of Glenpark Street

- *Potential Improvements* – clean-up, cut back branches of trees, fencing of the perimeter, gravel.
- *Potential Funding* – Calton Area Partnership.
- *Potential Resources* – Land and Environmental Services (LES) Cleansing, LES Parks, Community Safety Glasgow (CSG) Community Payback, CSG Neighbourhood Improvement Team.

Tobago Street/Stevenson Street

- *Potential Improvements* – scraped back, layer of top soil, fenced off from Spectrum owned sites that are adjacent.
- *Potential Funding* – Calton Area Partnership, Thenue Housing Association, Development and Regeneration Services (DRS) City Deal.
- *Potential Resources* – LES Cleansing, LES Parks, CSG Community Payback, CSG Neighbourhood Improvement Team, CSG Re-create, Thenue Housing Association Estates Management.

Canmore Street

- *Potential Improvements* – clean-up, planting, create a path, incorporate container as part of the development e.g. tool storage unit.
- *Potential Funding* – Calton Area Partnership, DRS Stalled Spaces.
- *Potential Resources* – LES Cleansing, LES Parks, CSG Community Payback, CSG Neighbourhood Improvement Team, Local Community Group to maintain after development.

Dunn Street/Finnart Street

- *Potential Improvements* – ongoing maintenance, shrubbery cut-back similar to when Commonwealth Games took place.
- *Potential Funding* – not required.
- *Potential Resources* – LES Cleansing, LES Parks, Thenue Housing Association Estates Management, Clyde Gateway.

Agreed Actions

The sites at Dunn Street/Finnart Street are already being maintained and require little or no additional work to develop therefore these will no longer be considered as potential sites for development.

Proposal to be developed for Tobago Street/Stevenson Street. This would be the initial site for improving the vacant and derelict land in the Calton Ward.
