

CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.

Minutes of meeting held on 4th November 2015 in the City Chambers, Glasgow.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

1 The minutes of 5th August 2015 were submitted and approved

Consultation on proposal to establish new non-denominational primary school and catchment area within Dalmarnock area and amendment of catchment areas for Dalmarnock, Quarry Brae and Wellshot Primary Schools noted.

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Executive Director of Education Services regarding proposals to establish a new non-denominational primary school and catchment areas within the Dalmarnock area and to amend the catchment areas for Dalmarnock, Quarry Brae and Wellshot Primary Schools.

Consultation on proposal to close Elba Lane Nursery School and open a new nursery in the Dalmarnock/Parkhead area which is open all year and provides early learning and childcare for children from age six weeks to five years noted – Request to Executive Director of Education Services.

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Education Services advising of a consultation on proposals to close Elba Lane Nursery and open a new nursery in the Dalmarnock/Parkhead area which would be open all year and would provide early learning and childcare for children from age 6 weeks to 5 years.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report; and
- (2) requested the Executive Director of Education Services to confirm the current provision at Elba Lane compared to the proposed provision at the new facility.

Glasgow North East Events Programme update noted.

4 There was submitted and noted a report and presentation by M Binnie, Glasgow Life and D McGowan, Urban Fox providing the Partnership with an update on the three outdoor festival days and carnival parades which had taken place in July and August 2015 which were partly funded by this Partnership.

North East Local Operational Working Group update noted – Requests to the Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services.

5 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services providing an updated overview of the wide range of activities being undertaken by the Local Operational Working Groups (LOWGs) in relation to tackling environmental issues, advising

- (1) of the aims and objectives of the LOWGs;
- (2) that there were 7 LOWGs across the city which acted as the main delivery mechanism for Clean Glasgow at a local level;
- (3) that the North East LOWG met on a 4-6 weekly basis to discuss, develop and progress joint actions in relation to the current priority locations and issues across Ward 9;
- (4) of the various activities that had taken place within the Ward from July to September 2015;
- (5) of the Calton ward summary statistics; and
- (6) of the LOWG's action plan.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the progress report of the LOWG and that further update reports would be submitted to this Partnership;
- (b) requested the Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services to
 - (i) display more dog fouling penalty signs throughout the ward;

- (ii) ensure there is more focus on enforcement action regarding littering and other anti-social behaviour offences in the vicinity of Celtic Park before and after matches.

Neighbourhood Management - Anti-social behaviour update noted.

6 With reference to the minutes of 3rd December 2014, when the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan (ASB), there was submitted and noted a report by the Chief Constable, Police Scotland advising of the progress made in relation to the anti-social behaviour outcomes, as detailed in the report.

Co-Location of Scottish Ambulance Service resources noted.

7 There was submitted and noted a report by the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service regarding the co-location of Scottish Ambulance Service resources at Calton Community Fire Station.

Thriving Places update noted.

8 There was submitted and noted a report by the Acting Executive Director of Corporate Services providing an update on the Thriving Places approach in Parkhead/Dalmarnock/Camlachie area.

Integrated Grant Fund Area Budget Review and Development of Investment Plan noted etc.

9 There was submitted a report by the Acting Executive Director of Corporate Services regarding the Integrated Grant Fund Review for the Area Budget and Development of its Investment Plan, advising

- (1) that the proposals approved by the Council's Executive Committee on 25th June 2015 in relation to the Integrated Grant Fund Area Budget had been noted at the last meeting of the Partnership on 5th August 2015;
- (2) the Area Partnership was invited to develop an Investment Plan using the Area Partnership's priorities for the IGF Area Budget 2016/17;
- (3) that the Area Partnership should focus on identified priorities in the allocation of its area budget; and
- (4) of the framework for the development of the Area Partnership Investment Plan for 2016/17 as detailed in the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the
 - (i) report;
 - (ii) framework for the investment plan as detailed at Appendices 1 and 2 of the report; and
 - (ii) timetable for agreeing the Area Partnership's Investment Plan; and
- (b) agreed to engage with stakeholders via social media and other on-line platforms, however traditional methods should be available if requested.

Area Budget 2015/16 – Monitoring statement and applications for funding dealt with.

10 There was submitted a report by the Acting Executive Director of Corporate Services detailing a monitoring statement and applications for funding from Calton Area Budget 2015/16.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted that, to date, £18,411 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward, leaving a balance of £46,849; and
