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**Award of the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services Tender
GCC006354SW**

Purpose of Report:

- 1) To advise Contracts and Property Committee of the outcome of the tender for Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services.
- 2) To seek Contracts and Property Committee approval for the award of contract to the recommended Bidders as outlined in Section 3.4 of this report.
- 3) To seek Contracts and Property Committee approval for the direct award of contract to the Recovery Communities services as outlined in Section 4 of this report.
- 4) To advise Contracts and Property Committee that that Lot 3 of the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services contract will be re-tendered, as outlined in Section 5 of this report.
- 5) To note that should this re-tender be concluded during summer recess that appropriate approvals will be sought, and a report then provided to Contracts and Property Committee for noting of the outcome.

Recommendations:

The Contracts and Property Committee is asked to:

- a) Approve the awards of contract from 23rd June 2026 as detailed within section 3.5 of this report. The contract is expected to run for a period of 4 years, from services start date of 23rd September 2026, with an option to extend for a further 2 year period. Note that continuance of contractual arrangements will be subject to satisfactory service review outcomes being achieved;
- b) Note that Lot 3 of the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services Tender is unfilled and that it is the Council's intention to go back to market to fill this Lot;

- c) Approve Direct Award of contracts to each of the three Recovery Communities as detailed in this report at Section 4 for a period of 4 years plus the option to extend for a further 2 year period, with continuance of contractual arrangements being subject to satisfactory service review outcomes being achieved; and
- d) Note that should the re-tender of Lot 3 be concluded during summer recess that a report will be provided to the Contracts and Property Committee to note the outcome.

1 Background to Tender

- 1.1 Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services have been designed to deliver recovery oriented, trauma informed and person led community based commissioned services.
- 1.2 Significant consultation took place to shape service design throughout 2025 across three engagement events led by the GCHSCP Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services and included representatives from the Alcohol Drug Partnership (ADP) lived experience reference groups, and third sector providers. The outcomes of the workstreams shaped the tender strategy and tender documentation and ensured lived experience feedback was embedded into the service specification.

2 Tender Process

- 2.1 A Prior Information Notice (PIN) was published on Public Contracts Scotland on 10th December 2025 followed by a supplier event held in partnership with the Supplier Development Programme (SDP) to introduce the scope of the tender to the market. A Contract Notice advertising the Invitation to Tender was published via Public Contracts Scotland Tender (PCST) and UK Find a Tender on 14th January 2026, using a single stage open procedure for 5 Lots.
- 2.2 Following tender publication, a further supplier event was facilitated by the SDP which talked potential bidders through the tender documentation on PCST. Both supplier events were well attended.
- 2.3 The table below shows the Lots by name and the intended award outcome:

3 Evaluation

- 3.1 There were 38 expressions of interest made during the period the tender was live, with a total of 12 Suppliers submitting 17 bids across multiple lots:

Lot 4	1 Bid
Lot 5	11 Bids

- 3.2 The award criteria for Lots 1-4 was 70% Quality and 30% Commercial. Lot 5 award criteria was 100% Quality, and Commercial evaluation will be determined at the point of call-off in the event additional funding is made available for this Lot.
- 3.3 For all Lots there was a requirement to score a minimum of 60 marks in each of the scored award questions. One bid in Lot 1 and two bids in Lot 5 were unsuccessful due to not meeting the minimum quality scoring criteria.
- 3.4 The successful bidder/s recommended for award to Lots 1, 2, 4 and 5 are as undernoted, with no successful bid for Lot 3:

4 Direct Award of contract to Glasgow Recovery Communities

4.1 Originally tendered in 2020 by NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (NHSGGC), there are 3 Recovery Communities operating in Glasgow, one across each Locality area (North East, North West and South). Each Recovery Community is a registered charity and operates with a Board of Trustees.

4.2 The Recovery Communities are peer-led models of support embedded in the alcohol and drug recovery community of Glasgow. They deliver significant social value aligned with the strategic priorities of GCHSCP in supporting vulnerable individuals and their families and provide a compassionate, peer-led, and community-rooted environment that supports individuals in achieving and sustaining recovery from alcohol and drug use. This is accomplished through mutual aid, diverse recovery pathways, and inclusive, strengths-based approaches that empower people with lived experience.

4.3 Market analysis has demonstrated that the preferred procurement route would be to make a Direct Award to each of the existing Glasgow Recovery Communities to allow for the continuity of the support which is peer-led and delivered by volunteers with local knowledge and lived experience of alcohol and/or drug use.

4.4 The request is for the Committee to approve a Direct Award to each of the Recovery Communities for a term of 4 years plus the option to extend for a further period of 2 years, subject to satisfactory service review outcomes, in line with the contract term for the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services.

5 Re-tender of Lot 3

- 5.1 Due to the nature of services and the need for the whole system of services to be in place to support people in recovery it is the Council's intention to go back to the market to get Lot 3 in place as soon as possible.
- 5.2 Should this re-tender be concluded during summer recess appropriate approval will be sought to make the Award of Contract to the successful provider, with the outcome coming back to Committee for noting. The maximum annual value of Lot 3 is £389,897.

6 Contract Implementation and Contract Management

- 6.1 Contracts will be managed under the Social Work Services Contract Management Framework.
- 6.2 The implementation plan will be overseen and progress monitored by the Contract Management Commissioning Team.

The estimated total value across the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services contract, for Lots 1,2,4 and 5 and the Direct Awards to the three Glasgow Recovery Communities over the full contract term is £25,852,842. Following the re-tender of Lot 3 this will be an estimated total value of £28,192,224.

The contract awards for the Community Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services tender is based on prices submitted during the tender which remain fixed for the duration of the contract except at the discretion of the Council in line with any increases awarded to the Council for social care purposes.

As part of the tender submission bidders were required to indicate the Community Benefits being offered annually for the duration of the contract. Community Benefit themes were Recruitment and Employment, Skills and Training, Supply Chain Development and Community Engagement.

Providers being recommended for award to this contract have offered a range of community benefits including; career events, workplace visits, recruitment from priority groups, work experience placements, community support including clean ups and tree planting, participation in the City Region Wish List Hub, donation of surplus equipment to charities, support to community organisations in the Glasgow area who work with disadvantaged individuals, opportunities for staff to volunteer in local communities, and foodbank donations.
