**CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982  
PRIVATE HIRE CAR DRIVER'S LICENCE – SUSPENDED**

**Purpose of Report:**

To advise Members of the circumstances leading to the immediate suspension of Mr Abdullah Yasin 's private hire car driver's licence (PD34618).

## 1 Background

- 1.1 Mr Abdullah Yasin was granted the grant of his private hire car driver's licence by this Authority on 22 July 2025 for a period of three years with effect from 22 July 2025 and with an expiry date of 30 June 2028.
- 1.2 The Licensing Section received a complaint from Police Scotland on 12 March 2026 regarding Mr Yasin 's suitability to continue to hold a private hire car driver's licence. A copy of the complaint will be tabled at the meeting.
- 1.3 In view of the terms of this information and in terms of paragraph 12 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Mr Yasin 's private hire car driver's licence was suspended on 13 March 2026 with immediate effect for a period of six weeks, since it was deemed that his continued private hire car driving would be likely to cause a serious threat to public safety.
- 1.4 Members will be aware that following the immediate suspension of Mr Yasin 's licence, this Committee is required to consider whether it is necessary or appropriate to suspend or revoke the licence in terms of paragraph 11 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
