1	<p>Installation of dropped kerb at Provanhill Street to support accessible pathway into new park.</p> <p>Pavement conditions moving up to the accessible entrance are quite poor and narrow, having a dropped kerb at this central point makes it more navigable for wheelchair users and those with prams or other accessibility needs.</p>	<p>In the middle of Provanhill Street directly adjacent to site's accessible entryway</p>

2	<p>Ground Clearance for Creation of a Memorial Garden and Columbarium. What requires to be done initially before the garden is created is the removal of detritus dumped in the area called (the 'Cowp') Compartment Tertius and the removal and eradication of the 3 off identified invasive plant species. The proposed Memorial Garden will commemorate some 21,870 people in unmarked graves scattered throughout the Necropolis cemetery, but their exact locations unknown.</p>	<p>The Glasgow Necropolis Glasgow G4 0RH Compartment Tertius in the southeastern corner of the Cemetery</p> <p>Supplementary Information 1</p>

	<p>People from all walks of life. Among them are Nurses and patients from the Royal Infirmary and Gartnavel Hospitals who are here in numbers, 232 men from all military services, as well as many others from the First and Second World Wars who are commemorated on family monuments but are actually buried abroad. A Memorial Garden also serves to remember Glasgow citizens who travelled to distant places and died there particularly those in search of better health. It will provide a dedicated space to honour all these burials and will re-use the dislocated grave memorials and stone fragments, decoration carvings and columns which were relocated from their original locations in the cemetery to Tertius as part of the garden. The plan is to re-use other materials which have been left there eg concrete tortoise, concrete beams and granite pieces.</p>	
3	<p>The Monteath Mausoleum requires the following works to make it wind and watertight and prevent further deterioration.</p> <p>Freestanding scaffolding, installing of water and windproof enclosure around the mausoleum, steam cleaning the exterior before repointing with lime mortar, repairs to the two sections of roof, removing cast iron cramps and replacing with stainless steel, removal of any loose decorative carvings to be stored inside for safety, repair cracks in the stone, repair or replace entrance steps and repair original 1842 timber door, reduce the ground level outside to prevent flooding and install gravel drain around the building. This is all exterior works only.
