Dear Catherine

Could you confirm if Unite have presented proof to the council of operators totalling 10% of all registered operators, giving Unite the right to represent the trade regarding tariff negotiations, as you had G.T.O.F do

I will read the report and give you my thoughts on it. Initially, the CPI figure for the period was 5%, so 1.31% falls well short of keeping up with the economic climate

I believe the council has breached the Scottish Civic Act regarding consultation

I have had no communication with Dr Cooper regarding the Draft copy, nor am I aware of any operators I represent being involved in consultation with Dr Cooper.

90 operators: to what organised bodies are they affiliated to, I am unaware of any of my members communicating with Dr Cooper

Also, 90 is less than the 10% required by the council to speak for the trade.

I would ask you to seek clarity from Dr Cooper on his statement below

"Consultation with operators represented by taxi representative organisations has also been undertaken. A survey was undertaken resulting in 90 responses across a range of operating parameters and behaviours. These have been used to inform the review and are included in the analysis and reporting below."

You are supposed to speak to the members elected trade reps, not the members
