

Glasgow City Region City Deal – Accessible and Inclusive Design Forum – Progress noted etc.

4 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding an update on the progress of the Accessible and Inclusive Design Forum (AIDF), advising

- (1) that the AIDF had been established to support the Council's plans for investment in relation to place-making and connectivity, and the role that the City Deal Infrastructure Programme was playing in driving forward change in these areas, particularly the City Centre Avenues programme;
- (2) that the Council wished to ensure that the city's streets and public spaces were designed so that they were safe and comfortable for disabled people and people who walked, wheel and cycle and the AIDF provided such means to ensure that their needs were reflected in designs for streets and public spaces;
- (3) of the purpose and scope of the AIDF;
- (4) that the membership of the AIDF comprised of organisations who represented diverse disabled people and people who walk, wheel and cycle in Glasgow and the organisation and the Council had undertaken the overall management of the forum's meetings;
- (5) that 2 workshops had been held which provided an opportunity for members to meet in a public setting and discuss designs and design related principles; and
- (6) of the next steps, including the holding of a 3rd workshop.

After consideration and having heard Councillor Millar, Convener for Climate, Glasgow Green Deal, Transport and City Centre Recovery, the committee

- (a) noted
 - (i) the report and that further updates on progress of the Accessible and Inclusive Design Forum would be submitted to this committee; and
 - (ii) the concerns in relation to the lack of elected member representation on the AIDF; and
- (b) agreed that following the 3rd workshop, a meeting be convened with officers of this Council and members of this committee to discuss the work and membership of the AIDF.
