

Glasgow Violence Against Women Partnership – Work of Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conference noted.

6 There was submitted and noted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding the work of the Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC) as a public priority response to high-risk victims of domestic abuse, advising

- (1) that the Glasgow Violence Against Women Partnership (GVAWP) brought together a range of statutory and voluntary agencies in Glasgow to improve multi agency responses to women, children and young people who had experienced violence against women and girls;
- (2) that Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability Violence Against Women Services (NRS VAW) had responsibility for convening and co-ordinating the work of the city wide GVAWP and associated groups and to devise and deliver a city-wide multi agency strategic plan to challenge the existence of violence against women in the city;
- (3) that Glasgow Health and Social Care Partnership (HSCP) would shortly launch its Domestic Abuse Strategy and Police Scotland was drafting a strategic document to highlight commitments to tackle all forms of violence against women and girls;
- (4) in further detail of the Glasgow MARAC and the current position as detailed in the report; and
- (5) that all partners involved in GVAWP and MARAC Steering Group were fully committed to the MARAC model and further guidance was anticipated from the Scottish Government who had reconvened the MARAC Advisory Group.
