

## **Introduction of electric vehicle charging tariff – Update noted.**

**5** With reference to the minutes of 31st January 2023 (Print 5, page 571) noting an update on the introduction of an electric vehicle charging tariff, there was submitted and noted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability providing details of the Council's public electric vehicle charging tariff, advising

- (1) of the Council's current public electric vehicle charging infrastructure and that a further 119 charge points across 63 units for public use were currently planned to go live in 2023;
- (2) of the benefits and details of the tariff introduced on 11th April 2023;
- (3) that a 6-month review would be conducted and would consider ongoing costs associated with the network, network demand and arrangements for residents with no access to private parking and for commercial vehicle operators; and
- (4) that the tariff and pricing arrangement would thereafter be reviewed on an annual basis or more frequently should external market conditions or city demand change sufficiently.
