

## **Glasgow City Food Plan – Update noted.**

**4** There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding the development of a Glasgow City Food Plan (GCFP), advising

- (1) that the GCFP had been developed in response to the Council's 2018 Food Insecurity Enquiry that recognised the scale of need within the city and helped mobilise commitment to the development of a multi-agency city food plan that focused on working together to create a food system that made it easier for everyone in Glasgow to eat healthy, affordable, culturally appropriate, good food no matter where they lived, their income or personal circumstances;
- (2) of the development of the GCFP that recognised the importance of a resilient food system and the link between food, health, poverty, consumption, supply chains and purchasing patterns;
- (3) that the actions identified within the plan spanned 6 key themes namely, food poverty, community food, the food economy, catering and procurement, environmental issues and children and young people;
- (4) of the key highlights of work associated with the plan to date and the current challenges;
- (5) that a short life Glasgow Food Plan Working Group had been convened to co-ordinate some of the ongoing Service responses that supported the delivery of the GCFP; and
- (6) of an indicative action plan that mapped the specific responses to the GCFP, as detailed in Appendix 1 of the report.

After consideration, the committee noted

- (a) the background and context related to the development of the Glasgow City Food Plan;
- (b) the convening of the short life working group to co-ordinate reporting on the progress of the Plan within the Council; and
- (c) that the progress would be reported to this committee as required.
