

### About the statistics within this report



## City of Glasgow Total Incidents (North East Sector)




During the second quarter of 2022/23 SFRS have responded to a total of 1,247 incidents in the North East Sector of Glasgow City. The nature of calls is becoming more diverse. As a result of this, SFRS are providing greater public protection across the Emergency Response we provide and this is strengthened through the Prevention and Protection activities carried out throughout the area.

## Deliberate Fires




The figure of 337 Deliberate Fires in Q2 2022/23 shows an increase of 131 for the same period in 2021/22.

## Accidental Fires



The figure of 124 accidental fires for Q2 2022/23 has seen an increase of 1 incident from the previous year's figures of 123. The service installs linked detection in eligible properties, those being owner occupied and high-risk, in compliance with the new Scottish Government Legislation.

## Dwelling Fires





There were 58 Dwelling fires in Q2 of 2022/23, this is an increase of 1 from the previous year's figures.

## All Fire Casualties




It is pleasing to report there were no fatalities this quarter due to fires. There were however 5 fire casualties.

## Non-Domestic Fires




The figure of 16 is an increase of 1 from the previous reporting period in 2021.

## Unintentional Injury and Harm



During the Q2 period, SFRS attended 186 special service incidents, an increase of 18 incidents from the previous year's figure.

## Unwanted fire Alarm Signals



The figure of 327 for Q2 2022/23 shows a decrease of 20 UFAS incidents from the figure of 347 for the same period last year. It is recognised that many historically regular premises of high UFAS activity were directly affected by the Scottish Government Restrictions in 2020/21 and we are now seeing them return to normal levels.

# Prevention and Protection Activities

## **Fire Skills**

We have developed a one-day Fire skills course which has been delivered at Calton fire Station, allowing groups to engage with their local Fire Station and learn skills such as CPR, Fire Safety and Water Safety. Referrals can be made through various partner agencies such as Police Scotland, Social Work and community bodies. The majority of referrals have come from Campus Cops in Schools. We have courses booked to take place for the rest of the year at Calton Fire Station and other stations throughout the city as this is a city-wide initiative.

## **Water Safety**

We have prioritised reducing the amount of water deaths within Scotland by running a series of engagement events in parks and near bodies of water within the city in partnership with the Glasgow Humane Society, Police Scotland, HMC. We are running a joint exercise and training with Scottish Water with SFRS personnel from to introduce water safety skills to businesses along The River Clyde. This received national coverage on STV News.

## **Hate Crime Awareness**

The P+P department have established a role within the Hate Crime Working Group to ensure a reduction in hate crime across the city.

## **Engagement**

Calton, Springburn and Easterhouse Fire stations have conducted 376 Home fire Safety Visits in Q2, targeting high risk properties, providing health and safety advice and fire safety education.

The Community Action Team has carried out 48 Engagement activities in Q2 in the North East Sector and 43 Home Fire safety Visits. These engagement activities included events such as Leaflet Drops, Fire Skills Courses, Anti-Social Behaviour engagement, Water rescue throwline Training, and Child trafficking awareness.
