

CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP'S MINUTES.

Minutes of the meeting held on 17th November 2021, by video conference.

Present: Councillor Greg Hepburn (Chair), Councillor Robert Connelly, Councillor Jennifer Layden and Councillor Cecilia O'Lone, Glasgow City Council; Station Commander Barry Cranstoun, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service; John Ferguson, Parkhead Community Council; Susie Heywood, Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership; and Lesley Ward, Glasgow Third Sector Interface Network.

Attending: A Croall (Clerk); A McMillan and D Speirs (for the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities).

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

1 The minutes of 18th August 2021 were submitted and approved.

Community Planning Partnership – Governance Framework – Membership Update noted.

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Council's Director of Legal and Administration regarding the membership of this Partnership, advising that Debbie McGowan had filled the vacant substitute representative position for the Glasgow Third Sector Interface Network.

GCPP Governance Review of Area and Sector Partnerships noted.

3 There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities providing an update on the progress of the review of Area and Sector Partnerships, advising

- (1) that on 7th September 2021, the GCPP Strategic Partnership noted the findings from the review of Area and Sector Partnerships and had agreed the principles that would underpin the new participatory democracy model;
- (2) the review had been conducted prior to the COVID-19 pandemic however served as a useful snapshot of responses and views that would be used to shape the future model for Area Partnerships;
- (3) the impact of the pandemic across the partnership had been considerable, alongside challenges, the pandemic had encouraged new ways of working and partnerships that would shape the new model of citizen-led, place based participatory democracy as detailed in the report; and
- (4) that a further report would be submitted to the GCPP Strategic Partnership meeting on 7th December 2021 and an update would be given at the next

Partnership meeting.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the report and thanked Derek Speirs for the progress to date.

Scottish Fire and Rescue Service – Ward Update noted.

4 There was submitted a report by Station Commander Barry Cranstoun, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) providing information to the Partnership on the current issues, incidents and work being carried out in the Ward for the period 1st July to 30th September 2021, advising

- (1) that 17% of accidental fires in the Ward area had been caused by cooking appliances that involved alcohol or drug impairment, that the common cause of deliberate fire settings had been refuse;
- (2) that non-fire casualties were 5% in the Ward area and this had been the lowest recorded in the past 5 years;
- (3) that Bonfire night had been busy, with no reported violent incidents, however there had been reported incidences of violence against the SFRS in the North Lanarkshire area; and
- (4) that SFRS had started community engagement programmes with officers attending local schools and this would continue following the ease of the COVID19 restrictions; and

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted and thanked Station Commander Cranstoun for the update; and
- (b) raised questions in relation to funding of new smoke alarms for the elderly, to which Station Commander Cranstoun advised that a home fire safety visit could be arranged and if the criteria of funding had been met then fire alarms would be fitted free of charge.

Area Budget 2021/22 – Monitoring Statement and Applications for Funding dealt with etc.

5 With reference to the minutes of the Council of 11th March 2021, when the Council agreed its budget for 2021/22 with overall funding available for Area Partnerships being maintained at 2020/21 levels, there was submitted a report by the Council's Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget for 2021/22, advising

- (1) of Calton Area Partnership's Budget for 2021/22 totalling £99,512.15, and that funds totalling £476.00 had been carry forward by this Partnership for the 2021/22 financial year;

- (2) of the approval of the Local Parks and Opens Spaces funding of £40,044 allocation for Tobago Street Play area and of the projects proposed at locations Helensea Play Park area and Queen Mary Play area;
- (3) of the Area Partnership's current budget position for 2021/22; and
- (4) of the applications for funding from the Area Budget for 2021/22.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted
 - (i) the position regarding Area Budget Allocations for 2021/22;
 - (ii) the monitoring statement, that £108,176.50 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward, as detailed in appendix 1 of the report;
 - (iii) details of an ineligible application and 2 applications dealt with under delegated functions, as detailed in the report; and
- (b) agreed the 2 projects which were proposed for the remainder of the Local Parks and Open Space Improvement Fund as detailed in the appendix to these minutes; and
- (c) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
