

1. Background

- 1.1 This report has arisen from a review of the initial cycle of Area Partnership meetings. The review identified that some Area Partnership members had expressed a view that in order to develop Area Partnership workplans, the Area Partnerships require some baseline/starting point information on the profile and issues affecting the local community.

2. Area Partnership Profile

- 2.1 The development of an Area Partnership “profile” would be in accordance with the remit of the AP and inform the work of the Area Partnership in the following ways:

- Enhance AP members knowledge of the Area Partnership Area;
- Assist in the identification of AP priorities;
- Assist in the development of:
 - the AP Workplan
 - the APs contribution to the North East Sector Implementation Plan
 - local Neighbourhood Management action plans
- Assist, by establishing a baseline position, in reviewing the operational progress made at an AP level towards implementing the strategic priorities of the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership (GCPP); Glasgow City Council; the Single Outcome Agreement and the North East Sector Implementation Plan and investment strategy.

- 2.2 The proposed profile would encompass information that is:

- already available at an electoral ward level, preferably at a datazone and/or housing neighbourhood level;
- is updated at least annually; and
- links in to the SOA and/or Neighbourhood Management Priorities.

Given those criteria, some of the data sources that would be included in the profile are in the following table

Some of this could draw on qualitative data that could be extracted from existing residents surveys or other sources, as well as potential consultation although this would have a resource implication which will require further consideration in due course.
