# Our focus. Your priorities.

This plan sets out local policing priorities to deal with concerns raised in our consultation survey, numerous community meetings and via your local elected members. It also outlines how we intend to tackle these priorities.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder to create safer communities. We aim to work closely with our partners to find effective long-term solutions to the issues raised.

## Local Priorities

You identified concerns about the following:

### **1. Drug Dealing and Drug Misuse**

You told us that you were concerned about the levels of drug dealing and drugs misuse which affected your area.

### **2. Violence and Antisocial Behaviour**

You told us your concerns regarding the level of violent crimes and antisocial behaviour within your community.

### **3. Dishonesty**

You told us your concerns regarding crimes of dishonesty within your community.

### **4. Road Safety**

You told us your concerns about road safety, particularly speeding motorists and antisocial driving.

We have already begun acting on your concerns and we are sure you will have already noticed some improvements in the Shettleston area.



# Our actions to date.

## **Drugs**

We have acted on the information provided by you, the community, to target those involved in the production and supply of controlled drugs. By working in partnership with other agencies we have maximised disruption opportunities and have seen an increase on those detected for drugs supply and production offences.

## **Antisocial Behaviour**

We have targeted those engaging in street drinking and the disorder and violence that can often accompany such behaviour. By adopting an intelligence-led approach to local policing, we have helped reduce the level of violent crime in the community. As a result, the number of assaults and other serious crimes of violence have decreased. Your community policing officers have continued to work closely with our partners including local housing officers and Community Safety Glasgow in dealing with those people engaging in disorder and antisocial behaviour.

## **Dishonesty**

We are aware of your concerns regarding homes being broken into, vehicle crime, bogus worker crime and theft of personal property. Your local policing team has dedicated significant resources to target these issues.

This has included working closely with partners, the media and the local community councils and community groups. This activity has resulted in significant arrests and crime prevention measures being put in place to reduce these crimes in your area.

## **Road Safety**

We have deployed officers to focus on issues affecting road safety and road crime such as speeding motorists, driving whilst using mobile phones, driving without seatbelts, antisocial driving and driving under the influence of drink or drugs. The community have clearly highlighted these areas as a real concern and we believe our efforts will contribute to keeping people safe.



# In the coming months.

## **Drugs**

We will continue to work with the public, partner agencies, local businesses and community groups to maximise the capture of information and intelligence to enable us to identify and target the most appropriate areas and crimes. We will continue to focus on those who are supplying and abusing drugs in the area.

## **Antisocial Behaviour**

We will carry out high visibility foot and cycle patrols throughout the area and will implement regular visits to licensed premises to tackle violent crime, disorder and drunken behaviour. We will continue to target under-age drinking and the illegal sale or supply of alcohol to young people through test purchase operations and other police and partner activity. Our Police Campus Officers will continue to work closely with local schools and community groups to engage with young people regarding alcohol, drugs, violence, gangs and antisocial behaviour.

## **Dishonesty**

With a view to reducing incidences and detecting offenders, we will establish a team of officers dedicated to targeting acquisitive crimes such as housebreaking.

We will also seek to identify and support vulnerable members of the community who may be targeted by bogus workers.

## **Road Safety**

We will listen to community concerns regarding road safety and road crime and deploy resources to the local areas highlighted by the community, community groups and elected members. Our consultation survey highlighted concerns relating to speeding motorists, driving whilst using mobile phones, driving without seatbelts, antisocial driving and driving under the influence of drink or drugs. We will attempt to influence road user behaviour to help keep people safe.
