

CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.

Minutes of meeting held on 3rd December 2014 in the City Chambers, Glasgow.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

1 The minutes of 8th October 2014 were submitted and approved.

Variation to order of business approved.

2 The Partnership agreed to vary the order of business as hereinafter minuted.

Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework - Future Partnership meeting dates noted etc.

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Corporate Services regarding implementation of changes to the cycle of partnership meetings, advising

- (1) of the revised meetings cycle of all Community Planning Partnership and Officer Group meetings; and
- (2) of the revised frequency of Area Partnership meetings and the specific dates of the 4 formal meetings of this Partnership in 2015 as detailed in the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) agreed to meet out with the Partnership meeting cycle to develop specific pieces of work in relation to Neighbourhood Management; and

- (c) noted the concerns expressed by Councillor Thewliss regarding the reduction in the number of formal meetings.

Introducing Fourteen - Presentation noted.

4 There was heard a presentation by Rachel Searle-Mbullu, Foundation Scotland, regarding the Fourteen programme supported by the Spirit of 2012 Trust, advising of

- (1) the outcomes and objectives that the Fourteen programme was committed to; and
- (2) how Fourteen would be implemented in the Calton area.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the report and thanked Ms Searle-Mbullu for her presentation.

North East Participative Innovations workshop evaluation report noted.

5 There was submitted and noted a report by the Executive Director of Corporate Services providing the Partnership with feedback from the Participative Innovations Workshop which was held at Celtic Park on 21st October 2014 in response to a review of community engagement in Glasgow.

Neighbourhood Management - Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan - Update noted etc.

6 There was submitted a report by the Chief Constable, Police Scotland regarding the current development of the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan, advising

- (1) of the identified outcomes which had not been included in the draft action plan; and
- (2) that the draft Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan would evolve over time and that that the plan would be considered as a starting point.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan, which could be adapted or added to as the Partnership progressed.

Area Budget 2013/14 – Applications for funding dealt with.

7 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Corporate Services detailing applications for funding from the Calton Area Budget 2014/15.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted an accrual of £1,089 from People's Development Trust had been returned to the Area Budget, therefore to date £44,540.80 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward, leaving a balance of £20,719.20; and
- (2) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
