

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> February 2015 in the City Chambers, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014 were submitted and approved.

**Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework - Membership of Area Partnership - Update noted**

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Council's Executive Director of Corporate Services, regarding an update on the membership of the Partnership, in terms of the Governance Framework, advising that

- (1) the North East Voluntary Sector held an election process in December 2014 and a representative from the Voluntary Sector Network (in conjunction with the Third Sector Forum) has now been secured until May 2017;
- (2) Kelly Glass had replaced Derek Kelter as the lead representative for the Voluntary Sector Network (in conjunction with the Third Sector Forum), with Annemarie Todd becoming the substitute member; and
- (3) Ruth Donnelly had replaced Douglas O'Malley as the representative for the Glasgow Community Health Partnership and Janet Tobin had replaced Laura Kemp as the substitute representative.

**North East and Local Operational Working Group – Update noted – Requests to Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services etc.**

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services providing an overview of the wide range of activities being

undertaken by the Local Operational Working Groups (LOWGs) in relation to tackling environmental issues, advising

- (1) of the aims and objectives of the LOWGs;
- (2) that there were 7 LOWGs across the city who acted as the main delivery mechanism for Clean Glasgow at a local level;
- (3) that the North East LOWG met on a 4-6 weekly basis to discuss, develop and progress joint action in relation to the current priority locations and issues across Ward 9;
- (4) of the various activities that took place within the Ward from April to September 2014;
- (5) of the Calton ward summary statistics; and
- (6) of the LOWG's action plan.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the annual report of the LOWG and that further update reports would be circulated to the Partnership; and
- (b) requested the Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services to
  - (i) submit a report/presentation to a future meeting regarding the enforcement process in relation to tackling the issues of flytipping and littering; and
  - (ii) liaise with Housing Associations within the Ward to ensure that tenants were made aware on which days refuse collection and bulk uplifts would take place.

#### **Neighbourhood Management - Anti-social Behaviour update noted – Request to Chief Constable, Police Scotland.**

4 With reference to the minutes of 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014, when the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan, there was submitted a report by the Chief Constable, Police Scotland advising of the progress made in relation to the Anti-social Behaviour outcomes.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report;
- (2) identified areas of concern in relation to loitering and anti-social behaviour; and

- (3) requested the Chief Constable, Police Scotland to liaise with the Housing Associations within the Ward and collate the information already gathered from survey's conducted by the Housing Associations in relation to community safety.

### **Glasgow's Single Outcome Agreement – Progress on the alcohol theme noted.**

5 There was submitted and noted a report by Glasgow Community Health Partnership regarding the progress being made in progressing Glasgow's Single Outcome Agreement alcohol theme.

### **Area Budget 2014/15– Final monitoring report noted.**

6 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Corporate Services detailing the final spend from the Calton Area Budget 2014/15.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the report and that £65,260 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward.

### **Area Budget 2015/16 – Budget allocations noted –Applications for funding and travel passes dealt with etc.**

7 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Corporate Services, advising of funding allocations for 2015/16 approved by the Executive Committee on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2014 (Print 6, page 433) and detailing applications for funding, including playschemes and travel passes, from the Area Budget 2015/16.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted that the Calton Area Budget allocation for 2015/16 was £65,260;
- (2) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-

- (3) in terms of the Travel Pass Scheme, approved the issue of travel passes for use during the school holidays of spring, summer and October 2015 periods to Connect 2 OSCS – Dalmarnock and Mile End OSC; and
- (4) approved the award of playscheme funding as follows, subject to satisfactory assessment and receipt of any outstanding information:-
