## **1. Background**

- 1.1 The Governance Framework for the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership structures sets out a key role for the Area Partnerships which includes the following:-

To co-ordinate the development and implementation of electoral ward level Neighbourhood Management action plans which respond to local needs and opportunities.

- 1.2 As part of developing a ward Neighbourhood Management Action Plan, the Area Partnerships identified a key priority of crime with a focus on anti-social behaviour.
- 1.3 In order to drive this agenda, the Calton Area Partnership considered reports at recent meetings. The report at the last meeting of the Area Partnership provided an update on the Anti-Social Behaviour outcomes.

## **2. Calton Area Partnership Anti-Social Behaviour Outcomes**

- 2.1 At the meeting of the Area Partnership on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014, the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan.
- 2.2 A summary of the progress made by the Partnership in relation to the agreed outcomes since the last meeting is detailed below:-

### **Young people made more aware of provision in their area**

### **Reduction in loitering/Increase feeling in community safety**

#### *Community Areas*

The four areas which make up the Calton Ward, South Dennistoun, Parkhead, Calton, Bridgeton/Dalmarnock have been allocated out to four of the five shifts with a view to drawing up an action plan in each area to combat anti-social behaviour, to include loitering. Each of the five shifts will thereafter be responsible for delivering a policing response to impact upon such behaviour.

#### *Deployment*

Officers have been deployed into each of the four sectors to increase attention on the areas most affected with targeted patrols focused on areas where youth disorder and anti social behaviour is highest. This has allowed for parallel deployment along with Community Safety Glasgow (CSG),

including the sighting of a redeployable camera to focus on Monteith Row. There has also been extensive additional patrols around Calton area on account of anti social behaviour linked to persons.

### *Joint Working*

Joint approach with CSG and police to issues identified and also stronger links being forged with housing providers and community groups to ensure that a consistent message is put across to encourage persons to call and report issues to police.

### *Agreed Actions*

Whilst there are four areas there are only two neighbourhood management representatives and I would be seeking two further volunteers from Calton and Bridgeton/Dalmarnock respectively to work alongside police in the formulation and measurement of how successful the plan has been.

## **Reduction in misuse of vacant and derelict land**

### *Site Visits*

An invite was extended to the Area Manager (Land and Environmental Services) to attend site visits within the ward. He provided a steer in relation to pieces of vacant and derelict land that were in most need of attention within the ward.

The site visits took place on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2015 and 4 potential sites for improvement were identified as detailed below:-

### *Information Gathering*

An email was issued to Access, Development and Regeneration Services (DRS) and Clyde Gateway to confirm ownership of the sites listed above and if there are any proposed plans already in place to develop these sites and timescales for work to begin.

1997	Tobago Street/Stevenson Street	Glasgow City Council/Private - Considered as a possible site under the Collegelands: Calton Barras City Deal proposals. Proposals are for site remediation/enabling works/access (scheduled for 2020) – however this is very much at an early stage and no discussions have taken place with the owners.  Any short term measures to tidy up the site would be welcomed.
3602	Canmore Street	Glasgow City Council - No development proposals planned.
4093	Former Gas Works, Dunn Street/Finnart Street	Glasgow City Council/Clyde Gateway - No development proposals planned.

### *Agreed Actions*

A meeting will be convened with Land and Environmental Services, DRS, Community Safety Glasgow and relevant Housing Associations to develop proposals for improving the vacant and derelict land sites identified.
